GUARDIANS OF CREATION

Update on Warsaw 2013 - the United Nations Conference on Climate Change

The conference closed last weekend, but not before a new deal on climate change was signed after an epic 30 hour long negotiation. The over 5,000 deaths and devastation inflicted on the Philippines by typhoon Haiyan surely helped spur delegates to agree on the new deal. The "Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage" is tasked to provide countries with technical support, facilitate actions and improve coordination inside the UN Climate Convention as well as other organizations like the Red Cross, MSF and Oxfam. The lead negotiator from the Philippines – Yeb Saño, in his opening address to the UNCCC, linked man-made climate change to the super typhoon that obliterated his hometown. He made an emotional plea for action and declared he would FAST – in solidarity with his people, until there was "meaningful progress" at the talks.

He asked citizens around the world to sign his online petition demanding progress. The goal was to get 1 million signatures to be given to the negotiators at the climate talks. His call to action was boosted by several organizations like Credo and Friends of the Earth. Within one week the petition gathered more than 650,000 signatures. It is now approaching 750,000.

Yeb's call for action seems to have worked so far. A deal was made. **This is surely a sign of HOPE.** People around the world have been deeply moved by this man's act of solidarity.




IT'S A GIRL FILM

Penticton: Penticton Okanagan Indian Band (Sn Pint'Ktn)
Princeton/Hedley: Upper Similkameen Indian Band (Similikameugh)

West Kelowna: Westbank First Nation (Tsinstikeptum)
Winfield: Okanagan Indian Band (S-Ooknahkchinx).

On the Second Sunday of Advent, the weekend of 7-8 December, the Diocese of Nelson as well as other Dioceses across Canada, will participate in a pew collection entitled **Moving Forward: A Campaign for Healing and Reconciliation.** The pew collection will fund projects to build bridges with the Aboriginal Peoples of Canada who have suffered the trauma of the residential schools.

It is difficult for many to understand the ongoing trauma of residential schools since these schools have been closed for almost a generation. However, five generations of Aboriginal children, often at the age of five and six, were removed by force from their families and communities and consigned to residential schools. Brothers and sisters were separated from one another. Children grew up with very limited contact with parents, family and community. The rupture within family and community relationships persists to our present day. The problem was created over five generations and it will require time, patience and effort to heal.

Moving Forward: A Campaign for Healing and Reconciliation appeals to your generosity to create outreach programs into the First Nations communities of our region. Your donations will be used for the following programs:

 Returning to Spirit – A well-tested program which brings together Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal participants in a three-part program of healing. Returning to Spirit builds bridges of understanding. Last year, Returning to Spirit was conducted in the East Kootenay region. It is our hope to conduct another session of **Returning to Spirit** in the East Kootenay region. We also wish to bring **Returning to Spirit** into the South Okanagan.

- Grief Support Group at St. Mary's Band (Agam) of the Ktunaxa First Nation in Cranbrook
- First Nations Healing Support Group on the Chopaka Reserve near Osoyoos
- Coffee House for Aboriginal Youth in the South Okanagan
- Program to introduce First Nations languages and culture to the Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal students at St. Mary's School (Cranbrook), Holy Cross School (Penticton) and Our Lady of Lourdes School (West Kelowna).
- Program of the Catholic Independent Schools of Nelson Diocese (CISND) to educate school employees about the residential school legacy and to build a positive appreciation for First Nations history and spirituality.

I am asking that the Diocese of Nelson participate in the Canada-wide collection, **Moving** Forward: A Campaign for Healing and Reconciliation. Your donations will be applied to healing and reconciliation within our own communities and among our own peoples.
