PASTOR'S MESSAGE

The Sacrament of Reconciliation is an extension of Jesus' once and for all sacrifice on the cross. Scripture tells us that he came in order to reconcile all humanity to the Father and to call us to forgive one another as he has forgiven us. The Risen Lord shared His power to forgive with the apostles by breathing the Spirit on them: "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven; whose sins you retain, they are retained."

Many people have lost a sense of God's gift of forgiveness. And, coupled with a poor understanding of sin and how it plays a part in each of our lives, we have lost a true sense of gratitude and joy, both in Christ and his gift.

In our desire to identify ourselves and our neighbours as "good people", we fail to see that our goodness is never in doubt. The Bible is clear: each one of us has been created in the image and likeness of God. Sin doesn't change that. But sin does change the way in which we perceive God and our purpose in the world. In short, sin affects our relationships and our call to holiness, to be as God created us to be.

Conversion begins with an understanding of God's love and a willingness to examine our lives in the context of God's Universal Call to Holiness. With Him there is no settling for mediocrity, lukewarmness or half-measures. What is it that prevents me to love as he loved, to forgive and serve in the same way he did and to offer myself in my present state of life for the sake of the kingdom? Beginning with pride, sin can be defined as anything that causes us to fall short of the true mark.

The time leading up to the Sacrament of Reconciliation, as well as the Sacrament itself, is a response to God's Grace—a desire to recommit oneself. To be called upon, as a priest, is a great blessing. Please feel free to approach me at any time before or after Mass. Or, if you need a little extra time, do not hesitate to call me for an appointment.

SEASON OF CREATION

Let's Co-Create the Web of Life



Alert observers may have noticed that the Web of Life installation has been hung near the main doors of St. Charles Garnier Church. Now what?

Let the fun begin! Bring natural items to hang on the Web, using attachment materials contained in the cloth zippered bag hanging nearby, to affix your items to a strand of the Web.

The Web of Life is the life support system for our planet, so anything natural which serves that purpose (animals, insects, humans, air, water, soil, plants, trees, etc.) is a potential addition to our evolving Web. Just to jump-start the creative process, here are a few examples: a sprig of lavender, a feather, a pinecone, a container of dirt, a flower, a leaf, a cob of corn, a lock of hair, etc. If we or any of our creature-kin need it to survive, it belongs on the Web.

Prayer: Triune Web-Master, You give and sustain the life of all, as we live in dependence on You and in interdependence on all that is contained within the Web of Life. Teach us to love creation as You do and to care for the cosmos that You have made out of love. Amen. Let it be so.

LAUDATO SI' LIFESTYLE CHALLENGE

Pick one or two challenges to do each week:

- Turn your air conditioner thermostat up 2 degrees—or, better still—turn it off at night and open the windows.
- Check your financial investments and divest from those which are fossil-fuel related. Invest in ecologically-friendly stocks instead.
- Spend 30 minutes/day outdoors for 30 days this month, to appreciate creation.
- Sign up to receive the church bulletin electronically so fewer paper bulletins can be printed.
- Use only tap water, not bottled water.
- Wash clothes in cold water.
- Recruit three people to sign the Laudato Si' pledge.
- Eliminate meat for four days a week.
- Shop and cook with locally-grown food.
- Reduce, reuse, recycle.
- Declutter a closet and give what isn't truly needed to a charity that helps the poor.
- Walk, bike, carpool.
- Consume less. Before buying a new item ask, "Do I really need this, or do I just want it?"
- Use reusable bags, rather than plastic single-use bags, for shopping.

PRAY WITH THE SAINTS OF CANADA FOR THE 150TH

Saint François de Laval (1623-1708):

St. Francois de Laval was born in 1623 in France and entered the local Jesuit college at the age of eight. He spent the next decade studying theology and became a priest in 1647. He was appointed the first bishop of New France when he was 36 and "is admired for his pastoral work among the Aboriginal Peoples and the settlers of New France, and for trying to defend Native People from being exploited by merchants and governors" (CCCB). He was canonized in 2014 and his feast day is May 6.

We pray: Dear Saint François, you were Québec's first shepherd, a good and brave man who was a key person in our country's social and religious history. You travelled on foot, by canoe and wearing snowshoes to visit and comfort many people. Intercede for us, so that all Canadian citizens may be inspired and never tire to find ways to live out acts of mutual forgiveness in homes and communities everywhere. Amen.


