BUILDING A WORLD OF JUSTICE

In many countries, such as Burundi and Guinea, elections may either consolidate peace or mark a return to violence. In 2010, these two African countries held important presidential elections. Development and Peace partners helped to ensure that these elections were conducted in a transparent and peaceful manner.

In Burundi, the *Kamenge Youth Centre* organized workshops for young people who would be voting for the first time. The Episcopal *Justice and Peace Commission* and the *Civil Society Coalition for the Monitoring of Elections (COSOME)* played a central role in observing elections across the country.

In Guinea, Religious Leaders of Guinea, Together for Peace, an interfaith project financially supported by Development and Peace allowed the first democratically-elected president to take office without having to confront a new—and dreaded—civil war.



LENT 2011 - WEEK 2

- **Minimize disposables** at work. Use a mug for coffee Starbucks uses 1.9 billion cups per year. These as well as other disposable coffee cups like Tim Horton's end up in the landfill. CBC reported last year that researchers at the University of Manitoba started a pilot project to turn discarded Tim Horton's cups into ethanol. www.cbcnews.ca 2010/07/05. According to their findings, they are able to produce 1.3 litres of ethanol from 100 cups. Apparently, the bacteria that feed off the paper mulch and then create their own waste ethanol and hydrogen, seem to prefer Tim Horton's to Starbucks. Go figure!
- **Save paper:** print double-sided. Also, try wrapping presents in colour comics or reusable gift bags; tea towels or pillow cases. Yes, it has been done and it works! Follow the theme of the gift. If you must get a bag choose unbleached paper over plastic or metallic. Safer, no dyes, no chemicals!
- **Pray** for the people on the frontlines of environmental disasters and climate change: the people of Japan, Haiti, and Brazil. **Pray** ... that the people of Libya may not be ravaged by war.
- Spend some extra time in prayer, thanking God for the beauty of Creation. Reflect on Psalm 148. Share with someone what you learned!
- Many electronics draw power even when off. Place computers, radios and TVs on a power strip, and really **TURN IT OFF**. We invite you, to join the 60 minutes **EARTH HOUR** movement on Mar 26 at 8:30pm by turning off your lights for ONE hour. We encourage you to go the extra mile and turn off all your electronics.
