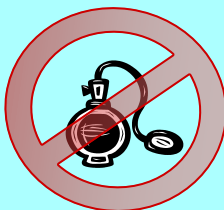

BISHOP PLEADS GUILTY

STATEMENT FROM THE CANADIAN CONFERENCE OF CATHOLIC BISHOPS:

Bishop Raymond Lahey, former Bishop of Antigonish, has pled guilty to the possession of child pornography. The Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops condemns all forms of sexual exploitation, especially involving minors, and continues to work to prevent such behaviour and to bring healing to the victims and their families.

Recognizing the confusion and anger that this case has engendered among many of the faithful, we underscore our pastoral concern for those who have experienced great pain as a result of these events. In a special way our thoughts and prayers are with the people of the Diocese of Antigonish and all the Atlantic region.

We reiterate the Catholic Church's long-standing condemnation of the possession, distribution and use of child pornographic images in all forms, and renew our resolve to do everything we can to promote the dignity and respect of the human person.

STATEMENT OF THE HOLY SEE:

Bishop Raymond Lahey, former Bishop of Antigonish, has pled guilty to possession of child pornography.

The Catholic Church condemns sexual exploitation in all its forms, especially when perpetrated against minors.

Although the civil process has run its course, the Holy See will continue to follow the canonical procedures in effect for such cases, which will result in the imposition of the appropriate disciplinary or penal measures.

What is a Mission?

Are you so involved in scurrying around with business, children, family, social activities that you have little time for quiet contemplation with God? A mission is a time of special grace when God calls us into a deeper relationship with Him, a time for personal growth, a time to listen to God, a time of spiritual refreshment and invigoration.

Who is a Mission for?

The Mission is for all people, from inactive to very active. It is for all ages and for any stage in life—married, single, divorced, separated, widow, etc. We particularly invite those who want to know more about the church today and how it can take an active role in the everyday experiences of work, leisure, family and politics.

What form will this Mission take?

Each evening there will be a special parish mass and homily designated to increase our spirituality. A social will follow in the hall to enhance our feeling of parish community. The mission priests will be available for informal chats and questions and answers. So that all may attend, other parish functions will be canceled during Mission Week.



Fr. Richard Gielow, C.M. was born in LaSalle, IL in 1943 to Virginia and Robert Gielow. He was ordained a priest of the Congregation of the Mission of Saint Vincent DePaul in 1970. From 1971-1976 Fr. Gielow served as Director of Vocations for the Vincentian Fathers and Brothers. In 1976, he was appointed Rector and Principal of St. John's High School Seminary in Kansas City, MO and filled that position until 1982. He was then asked to join the Vincentian Parish Mission Team and has been a member of that team until the present time.

Father Gielow holds a B.A. in Philosophy, a M.Div. in Theology from DeAndreis Institute of Theology and a M.A. in Religious Education from Catholic University in Washington, D.C. He is listed in the Midwest and Religious sections of Who's Who in America as a "well known preacher and retreat director".

Currently, Father Gielow is the Director of the Vincentian Parish Mission Center in Kansas City, MO. He is also the National Spiritual Advisor to the Ladies of Charity of USA.



Fr. Robert Gielow was born in LaSalle, IL in 1943. He attended St. Vincent DePaul High School seminary in Lemont, IL and graduated in 1961. Fr. Bob entered the Vincentian Fathers and Brothers novitiate in 1961. After two years as a novice, he completed his college education at Saint Mary's Seminary in Perryville, MO where he was awarded a B.A. degree in Philosophy. Father Gielow completed his theology studies at DeAndreis seminary in Lemont, IL. He was ordained in May, 1971.

After receiving a Master's degree in Counseling from Southwest Missouri State he joined the faculty of Regina Cleri Seminary in Tucson, AZ. After four years in Tucson, Father Bob joined the faculty at DePaul University in Chicago, IL. During his eight years at the University, he served as Director of Campus Ministry and as Director of Athletics. After completing his Masters degrees in Divinity and Religious Studies, he became Director of Vocations for the Midwest Province of the Vincentians. He served in that capacity for four years. Upon completion of a Masters degree in Pastoral Studies at Loyola University in 1987, he joined the Vincentian Parish Mission team.

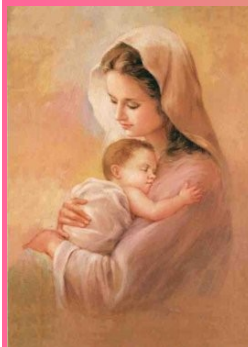

GUARDIANS OF GOD'S CREATION

IN MARY'S GARDEN

The month of May is dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, who embodies all of the qualities of a holy woman, because she is the mother of God, and because she is a mother and a woman, we feel close to her. Her life journey, like ours, was full of joyful, sorrowful and glorious moments. We can honour Mary in many ways, through the Rosary, special devotions and prayers that help us contemplate Mary's qualities and virtues. On this Mother's day we might honour Mary in yet another way by reflecting on the flowers that were named after her and immortalized in legends, that tell us about the significant moments in her life and that of her child Jesus. The tradition of associating Mary with flowers survived over many centuries through literature and art. Early Christians, especially those in the Middle Ages, kept the memories of Mary alive through legends. They envisioned her in a garden sometimes called a Paradise Garden; these special gardens were filled with flowers and herbs that reminded them of our Lady. As in Medieval times, legends about the many flowers and herbs can still inform and delight us today. Reflecting on the flower names, we can honour Mary and find relevance for our own lives. Examples include Lilies ~ who's white colour and sweet fragrance symbolize Mary's purity, humility, and loving obedience to God's will. Whereas the deep blue colour of the Iris symbolizes Mary's fidelity, and the blade-shaped foliage denotes the sorrows that pierce her heart. The violet's delicacy, colour, sweet scent and heart-shaped leaves, refer to Mary's constancy, humility and innocence. The Marigold ~ or Mary's Gold symbolizes her simplicity and domesticity. Baby's Breath signifies inspiration, and the power of the Holy Spirit. Marian gardens are designed to be a place of beauty that allow us to experience God's creation, and invite us to pray and meditate. We know that for centuries the rose has been associated with Mary, through religious art, and in the liturgical petition, "**Mystical Rose, pray for us**", let this be our heartfelt prayer, as we pray for all mothers this Mothers Day!
