Scripture Message

"Divine Mercy" is the Justice of God. Evangelist Paul in Romans 3:23 -24 wrote, 'Since all have sinned and fall short of the 'Glory of God', they are now 'Justified by his Grace, as a Gift, through the Redemption in Christ'. Liberation of the faithful people from 'Sin & Death, is achieved by the 'Suffering, Death and Resurrection of Christ'. The Divine Mercy Chaplet Prayer remembers this fact of Jesus' suffering and death in its Litany. (By the Sorrowful Passion, Have Mercy on the whole World) But Sacred Scripture attributes this Divine Mercy to God the Father, especially in the Gospel of John 3:16 "For God so loved the World that He Gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him, may not perish, but may have Eternal Life'. This is the pure benevolence of God, and we are eternally grateful.

God the Father took pity on the World and allowed His Son Jesus to undertake this Excruciating & Painful Death on the Cross in order to Redeem & Liberate His Faithful people from Sin & Death. Jesus Rose from the Death asking, "Death, where is your victory? Where, O Death, is your Sting?". (1Cor 15:55) The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God who gives Victory through Our Lord Jesus Christ". The early Apostolic preaching consisted of the facts of the 'suffering, death & resurrection of Christ'. The Apostles were empowered by the Risen Christ to perform many wonders / miracles among the believers to strengthen their faith. In fact, they had cured many sick people and drove away the unclean spirits from the possessed people. These Physical & Spiritual Healings brought many into faith in Jesus Christ.

Jesus not only worked through his disciples but also through those who were persecuted for their belief in Him. He made use of those persecuted Christian faithful to migrate to other foreign lands and helped them to evangelize everyone to have a friendship with him. The modern-day Church just continues what Jesus had initiated.

Jesus Commissioned His Disciples to become agents of Faith to reveal the purposes of God, explains St John's Book of Revelation (1:1-9,12-13 & 17-19) Faith begins with the Sacrament of Baptism, which is a Rebirth through Water and the Descent of the Holy Spirit. (Rm 6:4-9) Water symbolizes the Water of the Red Sea & the Water that Poured Out from the open side of Jesus Christ from the Cross. (Jn 19:34) Baptism gives rebirth through Water & Spirit. The faithful people participate in the Suffering and Death of Christ, by inheriting His Indelible Mark in their flesh. Since Christ is the Alpha & Omega (Rev1:8 & 22:12) He is the Lord of Heaven and Earth. "He is, Christ the King" (Jn 18:33) Pilate questioned Jesus: "Are you the King of the Jews?" Jesus replied, You say, I am a King. "I bear witness to the Truth. All those who are on my side listen to my voice", answered Jesus. We, the Christian faithful are encouraged to be on the side of Christ and proclaim Him loud and clear to the world by our readiness of Service and Fellowship!! All the Best.


Organizations within the parish could wear identifying clothing if they wish. Pictures could be outside or inside depending on weather.
