#### SCRIPTURE MESSAGE

This Week we explore the 'Parable of Talents/ Resources'. Talents & resources are to be developed & multiplied. If we develop, improve & multiply our skills, abilities & interests, we will be appreciated. Otherwise, we may be criticized or punished. One of the ways of improving our ability is to take a calculative risk in venturing into new things or activities. Let's consider whether risk taking is worthwhile / desirable or not? It depends on our mindset & background along with our circumstances. In 1845, the Irish people migrated to other countries due to the potato famine, which brought them modernity (from agro based society to the industrialized Canada). Our risk preferences are unique, and we have to live with our decisions. Therefore, it is worthwhile & desirable. (they assessed all aspects & consequences and moved out).

What about avoiding risks? Avoiding risks does not lead us anywhere. Risk taking gives us courage and optimism to face challenges and overcome them with optimism. For example, the First & Second World War veterans and their families underwent a terrible time in life. But they made a huge difference by opting to change their careers. Some War Brides became healthcare providers, and the men took up new and exciting technical employment. Modernity dawned on their life. Their morale was boosted due to their solid work ethics & credibility. Their risk taking for the most part channeled their stability, though some suffered stress & depression.

'Ships are safe in the harbour, but that's not what ships are for'. Ships are to explore the raging waters. As such risk-taking opens new doors and opportunities. (Ex: Thomas Edison who failed 32 times before he became successful with the electrical lamp) 'No failure for a believer', because the good

Lord Jesus is with us to lead, guide & give success. 'There's no failure' says the Scripture today. 'Positive Risks are calculated Risks & Negative Risks are motivated by impulses/emotions. Risk involves danger, tension, and possible loss. But it also has the potential of success, honor, and promotion/recognition.

J.K Rowling, the author of 'Harry Potter' at The Harvard Graduating Class in 2008 talked about 'Failures rather than Successes'. 'It is impossible to live without failing at some point in our life. We cannot play safe all the time'. In 1965 She was penniless when she started her career. She never had a computer. She manually typed all of her materials. 12 publishers rejected her materials initially. But she repeatedly tried & tried, which brought her success. 'Giving a Talent' is an 'act of trust'. Trust is a privilege, which needs to be enjoyed by the recipient and that privilege has to be shared with others. (Ex; Steve Jobs, the CEO of APPLE iPod seems to be a good example to multiply our talents). He identified his skills and developed them through many struggles and emerged as a great Icon of American investment from scraps.

Today's Scripture is a call for a' Calculated Risk' in using our skills and abilities, which the gospel calls as talent. God has invested in us great gifts and talents. He expects us to take initiatives to use them for the benefit of ourselves and our society. All God's gifts are talents, and He wishes that we share them with others in our loving Service & Love. We should not hoard it or waste it. God's calling is to 'arise and shine to our maximum best. May He bless every one of us with His Gentleness & Generosity to share our talents.


