PASTOR'S MESSAGE

'Desert Experience' is indeed interestingly educational in several spheres especially physical, mental, emotional, psychological and physiological. I had one such experience recently in Vancouver near Squamish - B.C for a week in November 2020. It was the deep lush green mountainous terrain loaded with grizzly-bear and other wild animals. For fear of being caught by these untimely creatures I skipped my walk most of the days except one. But even that one was very scary to walk in the midst of the deep woods of the thick forest land.

Probably this is how the ancient Israelite people might have felt when they walked from Egypt to Israel when God delivered them from their bondage. The only difference I could notice is that the land they crossed might have been dry rocky ground with plenty of thorn bushes, owls and wild animals. Hopefully certain parts of B.C especially Kamloops might give us a sense of this wilderness experience vibrantly. The Israelites grumbled and made complaints about each and everything. They failed to trust in God.

To-day's scripture is a call for us to walk through the 'desert of our lives'. Pope Benedict explains 'desert' as 'internal & external'. a) Internal is a place especially our conscience to set us right or to make peace, to restore and heal the broken heart. b) External is to get away from our daily routine especially the distractions we are used to and beginning to have a deeper dialogue and intimacy with our god. We begin to introspect into our lives as to what are our struggles and complaints or apathy and indifference. Basically, to analyze and reason out why we are not happy and satisfied?

Desert journey takes us away from our normal life and helps us to have a deeper vision of our existence. God visits with us and meets our needs strengthening us with his loving presence. We spent time to recollect our hardships, challenges and difficulties that we face and ask God to help us. Our willing promise to accept his guidance and encouragement trusting in his providence sustains us in this process. T.S Eliot in his 'Wasteland" analyses the 'Spiritual wilderness' of humans especially the 'feeling of absence of God in one's life'. (Cut off himself/herself from God and His Divine Presence) Dryness in prayer life leads to spiritual desert experience.

People of faith become unproductive under such circumstances. Therefore, wilderness experience is necessary to become spiritually fertile to bear good fruits. Advent journey helps us in this process through the reading and reflection of scripture in the quiet of our hearts. May God open up our hearts to His lively invitation.

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER




