Dear sisters and brothers in Christ!

Encountering God in our daily routines! Pope Francis encourages everyone to 'Encounter Divinity' in every small and large event of our ordinary daily life with our friends, family, strangers and acquaintances. Most people encounter wonderful personalities at odd situations, in a totally unexpected way or circumstance. For example, some have met their love of their life either in the sports arena, ski hills, restaurants, coffee parlours, tours or pilgrimages. People get excited when they meet great personalities accidently like the writers, religious and political leaders. Someone met Mother Theresa in a similar circumstance and stayed with her until her demise. A parishioner from our Diocese met the Queen of England on her tour to the United Kingdom. The Pope got down from his Pope-Mobile in one of his international tours to visit with a physically challenged person and excited that individual greatly.

I was at a Coffee parlour sometime back and met an interesting personality who shared with me his encounter with the Love of life for the past 60 years. He was able to cherish that happy moment and was savoring with great excitement. He was a great & successful uranium explorer from the Northwest Territories.

Much the same, today's scriptures share the exciting moments of the First Disciples of Christ Simon, Andrew, John and James. They were fascinated by Christ the handsome, young, penniless, vagabond preacher and excited to get acquainted with him. These fishermen were surprised when they met the Carpenter. When they listened to him regularly, their curiosity was aroused and made an option to stay with him for life. St. Paul calls this action as "finding a treasure trove" (2Cor 5:7) They found the Messiah, the Spiritual Treasure.



They were determined, ready and willing to make Christ known despite the challenges endured. They became stalwarts to spread the message of Christ, planted churches, called new disciples to engage themselves as messengers of Christ. In fact they became partners with Christ in this pursuit.

This week, the Church extends a call, inviting us to develop a deeper relationship with Christ so that we may become committed to this divine call and service. In our encounter with others, either in person, on the phone or online let us make an effort to pass on our excitement of 'Finding the Messiah' and like Christ who invited the first disciples 'to come and see him', welcome our friends and families to discover the riches hidden in Christ. May the Psalm that we reflect today (Ps 40) "Here I am Lord, I come to do your Will" give us this great mandate.
