PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear sisters and Brothers in the Lord!

"We have this great treasure in our clay vessels" 2 Cor 4:7 summarizes the scriptures of this week. We are reminded by Paul that we carry, 'Christ, the treasure, and his ideals and value systems' in our human body, which is made out of clay. We have inherited this treasure by the 'apostolic preaching of the good news'. We need to pass on this spiritual inheritance as our Christian heritage to our children and their children to follow and benefit after us.

The Prophet Amos, who lived around 750 BCE talked about the nature of the World community of Israel. Israel was very prosperous and peaceful during that time. Peace and prosperity led Israel to a National Consciousness. They took pride in their national heritage because their God had been so very benevolent towards them. He also noticed an oppressive social pyramid in their social life, especially the Class Inequalities and their drastic consequences, because the poor were victimized and the marginalized excluded by those who called themselves rich.

Israel was said to be very religious, but Amos noticed the 'decay of religious life at all levels', and openly voiced his opinions on the social crimes saying, 'religious decay was the root cause of these social crimes'.

With this background we would like to reflect the Scriptures today. Does society condemn the social injustices in our modern times? What about the Church's teaching on these issues of 'poverty, economic injustice, human rights, social justice, housing, food, clean water, voting rights, climate justice, healthcare, refugee crisis, racial justice, gun violence, hunger, food safety and so on'.

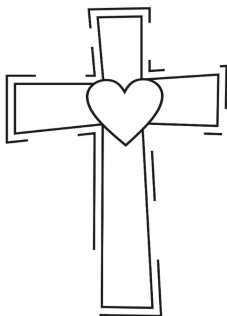
At this time the Church leaders themselves are under scrutiny for scandals, corruptions and power struggle? Will their voice be heard at all?

Amos was an Ordinary Shepherd, who was a Sycamore tree dresser, a seasonal employment he had for his livelihood. But he had a great sense of God stirring him up to voice his opinion on the social ailments of his time. During the time of Christ, he voiced his opinions vehemently on the inequalities of his time. The Apostles were able to point out the deviant behaviour of people in their time. In our time we are invited to take up this role and voice our pain and anguish against these hurting behaviour and attitudes that are at all high places.

If we are not voicing now about all these degrading and dehumanizing events, probably we will leave our children these ailments as our heritage. Therefore, we are given a timely reminder by Christ to become his inheritance and to give expression to his values & ideals. Let us invoke the good Lord's Blessings for this grace today.
