PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

"Grain of Wheat" (Jn 12:24) "Unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies it remains a single grain. If it dies, it yields a rich harvest". 'Grain of wheat' is an expression for selflessness which leads us to engage in generous and good will gestures towards others. It is losing ourselves in the care of our sisters and brothers. Selflessness is opposed to selfishness, which does not allow us to sacrifice but promotes to hoard our gifts, talents and treasures.

Pope Benedict XVI explained this concept of 'Grain of Wheat' as God choosing the best of the Seed, in the person of Jesus Christ, the Messiah, in human history. He planted Jesus in our human family in order to give us a vibrant role model for all humans to imitate. Since Christ was the best of Seed, he produced a 'bumper harvest, a wonderful crop' in human history and paved a way for a lasting Transformation, through his salient principles of Love of God and Neighbour', written in his Biblical Theology.

He taught the World the value system of generosity, unconditional love, non-judgmental attitudes and interactions. He went out of himself to reach out to all people without any reservation to befriend people through goodwill gestures. He initiated this transformation by his life and gave expression by his death. Therefore, he actually became a 'source of life and new beginnings 'for all who express their faith and love in him.

Today's Scripture is a vehicle through which the Church remembers his death with gratitude, as Jesus introduces his death in a colourful way using the natural farming imagery of the 'Seed at this Spring time', as gardeners are busy selecting their seeds this year for their bumper crop in the coming days'.

'Good Gardeners are experts in choosing their seeds from among the varieties of the same type of grain, flower or fruit that might give them a great satisfaction through a 'bumper crop and rich harvest' at thanksgiving. So quality seed is a precondition for a bumper harvest.

Jesus was dead and buried. But in his death 'he sprouted' and his movement became a reality through his disciples, who went out to the entire known world of their time to propagate his message of human transformation. Those in authority and who were responsible for his death thought that with the death of Christ and his burial, they had put an end to his movement. But before their dream could die out, Jesus germinated, he rose from the dead and challenged them more through his presence and appearances. That's how he strengthened his disciples to spread his ideals and values among people.

Today he is inviting us to become his Best Seed to propagate his mandate. Are we ready? Let us ask the Lord's guidance & strength during this Celebration. All the best!
