PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dearly Beloved Sisters and Brothers in the Lord!

St. Paul in the opening versicle of Philippians 1 writes, "All the Saints in Christ Jesus" meaning, 'all Christians set apart by their union with Christ Jesus', who witness the saving actions of Christ in their lives and walk as Companions of Jesus. Saint John Paul II explained, "Saints are Ordinary people who did ordinary things in an Extraordinary way for the love of Christ".

The Feast of All Saints remembers the Known (Canonized/Recognized) and Unknown Saints of all ages. The Book of Revelation 7:9 tells us that a huge number, impossible to count, of people from every nation, race, tribe and language, dressed in white robes and holding palms in their hands. They praised, "Victory to our God, who sits on the throne and to the Lamb!" All prostrated and worshipped God.

All these Holy People had one basic principle, 'love of God & neighbour (Mt 22:34-38) They had their own struggles, challenges & shortcomings, but they overcame them through the grace of God on behalf of their sisters and brothers they served. All of them were motivated by the example of Christ who sacrificed his life for humanity's sake on the cross. In turn, Saints were willing to sacrifice their lives in order to gain Christ and to be found in his Love.

We, who are living, look to them as models and guides on our journey towards Christ. Most of our Christian people have inherited Christian Names from the role model of the saints with the aim of imbibing the saints salient characteristics. Most often we make intercessory prayers to God through our favourite saints. The Church teaches that our baptismal grace gives us the ability to become a saint. Therefore we are "Saints in the making".



At the conclusion of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, on November 20, 2016, in his apostolic letter, entitled Mercy and peace (Misericordia et misera), Pope Francis invited us to celebrate the World Day of
