Dear Sisters & Brothers in the Lord Jesus!

"Are you the king of the Jews?" (Jn 18:33) asked Pilate. "Where is the infant born, king of the Jews?" (Mt 2.2) asked the Magi of the East. In the modern world most Kings and Queens have disappeared from their leadership roles except a few left like the Queen of England, who is also the Head of the Commonwealth Countries giving a great leadership. But there are a few dictatorial personalities still living and causing untimely havoc to human life and existence like the Saudi Crown Prince Mohammud Salman, who ordered the killing of the Journalist.

Modern Government Officials are either called President/ Prime Minister, elected by the Will of their people in their respective States who have turned out to be tyrants and criminals in their political & public life. The best example is the Syrian Assad and the Indian Modi who kill and destroy their civilians arbitrarily. The Burmese Military Leader is no exception in this category and he has the Philippines' PM & the Venusvalen' PM as his counterparts. These individuals deny human rights and rule by terror like Antiochus Epiphanus of the Jewish people (1 Mac 1-64) who killed 4000 Jews on the Cross in 167 B.C in order to create fear & terror in Jewish minds, and Hitler followed him saying, like the sick organ in the human body, Jews were to be eliminated from the entire World. 'The Holocaust' reminds us of Hitler's terror.

The Feast of Christ the King was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925 following WWI. Nine million soldiers were killed & 20 million wounded. The Holy Pope saw this sorry state of the World, and in order to give a Role Model of Leadership, established this Feast of Christ the King. The Pope saw the disrupted image of Europe in particular and the World in general after WWI. He deeply desired to tell the World to 'imitate the leadership of Christ the King' and not to abuse their power by acting selfishly and arbitrarily to achieve their hidden interests. Jesus established His Kingdom on the value system of Justice, Peace and Love (Rm 14:17) He never used military power, violence or weapons. He made use of compassion and mercy in order to make a difference and captivated the people to his side. Indeed, Christ the King identified himself with the rest of humanity through His Unconditional Love and Non-judgmental attitude. He is indeed a Radical Role Model for all Leaders and an ideal King. Jesus' Kingdom is not based on politics, power and control, but on Service which is primarily aimed at to make the life of people better.

Jesus became a source of Wisdom for all World leaders (1 Cor 1:23-24) He is the Power House for those who imitate him. He leads and guides those who adhere to his principles. He is the Good Shepherd and a Team Leader & never was a Solo-Player. Jesus invites us to partner his projects. The only requirement and investment is goodwill to work for Common Good. (1Cor 12:7) As we celebrate the feast of Christ the King today, let us pray that our leaders both in the Religious and Civic responsibilities may give expression to this vision of Christ in their leadership!



WHAT IS ADVENT

Pope Benedict explained 'advent is a time in which we experience the Presence of Eternity and eagerly await its arrival'. It's a time of Joy, an interior joy that no suffering can snatch or take away. It's a joy which we carry within us, giving us courage to continue forward into the future with confidence. Therefore 'advent' is translated as, presence, arrival and coming', says the Pope. We pause in silence to 'behold & understand this presence'. Technically the term 'advent' indicates the arrival of an Official, or visit of the King, or Emperor to a Province. It is celebrated during this season for the "Coming of the Divinity". Christians used the word 'advent' to express their relationship with Christ". Jesus the King entered the poor Province called the Earth, to visit with the Humankind.

Hebrews 13:8 "Jesus Christ is the same, yesterday, today and forever". Advent is a call to experience the Presence of God in Human History. It extends an invitation to 'Journey with the Divine'. During these days of grace, we relive the 'hopes and dreams of the ancient Israelite people' who journeyed with the Divine for the Birth of the Messiah. They were drawn to the grandeur of Mt. Zion where they experienced the Glory of God. The Prophet Elijah saw God's glory in this mountain. Every person and nation gathered at Mt. Zion perceived the majesty of God revealed in that mountain. The mountain of God became the goal of all the Nations in ancient times.

For us, advent is a period of "Eager Expectation" to make a hope filled journey in the foot-steps of Christ. We are encouraged to be 'Active Participants and just the Passive Recipients of this Hope". We are invited to make a New Beginning with Mother Mary, as she Rejoices with Christ". We reflect on God's initiative to come among us through the cooperation of a Human Mother called Mary, and with her consent, God, who is the Word, becomes Human. Because of this wonderful gift of life, the young Mother Mary Rejoices, and we join with her these days with our own eager expectation to 'Behold the face of God', in the Baby Jesus', says Bishop Gerald Wiesner OMI.

We hope all parishioners will abide by this request.




