Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord!

"Servant Leadership" is a vocation to participate in the Life, Ministry and the Suffering of Christ. We are all called to be leaders. Leaders are challenged to listen with the same passion with which they want to be heard. It's a great responsibility to lead and not to be misused by 'overpowering or lording it over' others. Power can corrupt and change people. Oftentimes it motivates them to misuse their role to achieve name, fame, glory, honor, status, power, influence and prestige. Jesus, our High Priest, understands our power struggle & weakness, failures and sympathizes. He is teaching that our greatness should depend on our humble service to those in need and not in the power struggle.

In the World's eye, if someone is a friend of a person in authority, he/she is considered to be a privileged person. They assume that they deserve respect & honor for their special friendship with the person of authority. They also consider themselves influential. They inherit glory, honor and privilege through their association with powerful and influential people.

In the Christian understanding we are called to establish a special friendship with the poor, marginalized, excluded, the needy, the alienated, exiled, the ostracized and the neglected. Through our humble service to these little ones, we merit greatness in the sight of the Lord. The World may not recognize our service, and sometimes it might ignore our work. But God always recognizes our services. We are the ones who associate with the Suffering Humanity of Christ, and we share 'His Cup' which is 'the cup of suffering'.

'Suffering brings healing' according to the Danish Philosopher Soran Kirkegarrd. When we unite our -

suffering with the suffering of Christ, it becomes meritorious and we share in the agony and anguish of Christ, who suffered for the whole human race. The Prophet Ezekiel (18:4) insists on individual responsibility when one suffers. Suffering should ultimately lead to conversion, change of heart, attitude and intention. It should prompt a transformation in one's life and activity. it should change one's situation and show the way to a New and Better life path for better possibilities.

Suffering is a challenge in human life and spirit, which automatically reinforces our Trust in the Almighty Power of God. We confide our faith and trust in His fatherly care when we suffer. It opens up our eyes to see the reality of the situation. We are not blinded by our phobia or imagination. 'Suffering is the best teacher' says the Greek Philosophy. When we share the burden of others who suffer intensely, we become the burden bearer after the heart of Jesus. Isaiah 53:3 reminds that Christ is our burden bearer. Today we are invited to come to him with our burdens so that he may be able to listen and console us with His Divine Grace! All the best!



STATEMENT OF APOLOGY

Statement of Apology by the Catholic Bishop of Canada to the Indigenous Peoples of this Land:


The Catholic Bishops of Canada, gathered in Plenary this week, took the opportunity to affirm and acknowledge to the Indigenous Peoples the suffering experienced in Canada's Indian Residential Schools. Many Catholic religious communities and dioceses participated in this system, which led to the suppression of Indigenous languages, culture and spirituality, failing to respect the rich history, traditions and wisdom of Indigenous Peoples. They acknowledged the grave abuses that were committed by some members of our Catholic community; physical, psychological, emotional, spiritual, cultural, and sexual. They also sorrowfully acknowledged the historical and ongoing trauma and the legacy of suffering and challenges faced by Indigenous Peoples that continue to this day. Along with those Catholic entities which were directly involved in the operation of the schools and which have already offered their own heartfelt apologies, the Catholic Bishops of Canada expressed their profound remorse and apologized unequivocally. Together with the many pastoral initiatives already underway in dioceses across the country, the Bishops pledged to undertake fundraising in each region of the country to support initiatives discerned locally with Indigenous partners. Furthermore, they invited the Indigenous Peoples to journey with us into a new era of reconciliation, helping us to prioritize initiatives of healing, to listen to the experience of Indigenous Peoples, especially to the survivors of Indian Residential Schools, and to educate our clergy, consecrated men and women, and lay faithful, on Indigenous cultures and spirituality. They further committed to continue the work of providing documentation or records that will assist in the memorialization of those buried in unmarked graves. A delegation of Indigenous survivors, Elders/knowledge keepers, and youth will meet with the Holy Father in December 2021. Pope Francis will encounter and listen to the Indigenous Peoples, so as to discern how he can support our common desire to renew relationships and walk together along the path of hope in the coming years. The Bishops of Canada have pledged to work with the Holy See and our Indigenous partners on the possibility of a pastoral visit by the Pope to Canada as part of this healing journey. We are committed to continue the journey with the First Nations, Métis and Inuit Peoples of this land. For more information, please contact the diocese or visit www.cccb.ca.
