Dear sisters and Brothers in the Lord!

This week's scriptures welcome us to reflect on the theme "Jesus the Divine Healer". He healed not only our physical infirmities but also our spiritual ailments. He surprised those who came to Him in faith and trust. He treated everyone with great concern and humor. Jesus was never judgmental, says St. James in our 2nd reading of today.

God always gave hope to the frightened people. When Israel was taken into Babylon captivity, God heard their cry for help and gave them Hope through the Prophets. It opened new possibilities for the Israelites to rely on God with full optimism and looked forward to their deliverance. Again, God intervened on their behalf to perform miracles through Moses and Aaron to open the Red Sea for their passage. He even provided them with 'manna' and 'water' from the rock miraculously. In the same way Jesus gives hope to all who look forward to God with optimism for a blessing. It may be a physical healing or a spiritual nourishment or some other request.

'Deafness and other Communication related Disorders Institute' reports that there are approximately 7.5 million people who suffer with speech related disorders in North America. People with speech impediments suffer with mental disorders. They need rigorous speech correctional services/Therapies. They should be given hope and encouragement. Let us not ridicule those with speech impediments. This will cause them severe damage.

Deafness is described as hearing loss. According to the World report on 'hearing disability' about 62 million people over 60 years of age suffer with hearing loss. There are about 56 million people who use hearing aids in the world today.

This is a very exciting month for Creation!!

Next weekend, September 12 at 2pm Fr. Gabriel will celebrate outdoor Mass at Seton House in Kelowna. Following Mass there will prayer at the labyrinth with an explanation. The names of the streets have changed and Seton House is not on Chute Lake Road, but on Upper Mission Drive, which goes straight where Chute Lake Road turns right 1 kilometer after Summerhill Winery. The liturgy at this time includes the incident where Jesus heals the deaf and dumb man, using his own sali-

va and the Aramaic word, ephphatha – 'be opened!' When Jesus' original Aramaic words are used in the Gospels, the Evangelists wanted to emphasize the original power of Christ's original utterance. They are used deliberately to underscore the intimacy of the moment and the personal relationship of Jesus with the one with whom He is communicating.


