Dear Sisters & Brothers in the Lord!

This week's Scriptures remind us of our Calling & Commission by the Spirit of the Lord to do good works. (Nu 11:25-29) The spirit of God descended on the Seventy elders and they shared the Spirit of Moses. The Spirit of Moses is to be understood as Power to lead, guide & perform miracles (extraordinary gift of the Divine to do good deeds) Great men passed on their spirit to their successors. 2Kgs 2:9 explains that the Prophet Elisha asked for the spirit of Elijah: "Let me inherit a double share of your spirit". Inheriting the Spirit is: "Being endowed with the Charism of the Spirit" (It is the 'Mysterious Divine Impulse' that motivates and moves a person to perform deeds that are above and beyond his human capacity.

The Book of Isaiah 41 explains that God commissions even those out of the Israelite fold (non- registered ones) like King Cyrus of Persia to perform a good deed. God motivated and moved Cyrus to release the Israelite people after 70 years of their exile in Babylon. (This was remembered as their 2nd Exodus and the first one being the release from Egypt by the Pharoah) King Cyrus also was instrumental in Rebuilding the demolished Jerusalem Temple with Royal Funds, as the Israelites were reduced to poverty and have become so very insignificant in their life.

The Acts of the Apostles tell us that "Miracles are performed in the Holy Name of Jesus" (Acts 4:10) The Jewish Sanhedrin questioned Peter and John, "By what power or by what name do you perform these miracles?" (They cured a lame man) Peter explained: "In the Name of Christ, whom you Crucified and whom God Raised". The Apostles healed the sick and performed miracles in the Holy Name of Jesus. The Church continues the saving mission of Christ even today.


Today's Gospel Mark 9:38-48 prompts us to ask the question " Can anyone outside of the Church or other than the Church perform miracles? Let us remember that it is "God who heals" and humans are only instrumental. The Divine Power comes to the believer by the 'outpouring of the spirit'. Acts 2: 5-10 tells us that by the Outpouring of the spirit, people were able to speak in tongues, perform miracles to the amazement and astonishment of the onlookers.

Does God give Power to those who do not belong to our community of Christian Faith (Non-registered) to perform Miracles? The Book of Num11:25-29 narrates that the Lord gave the Spirit of Moses to the 70 elders. But there were also some like Eldad and Medad who were out of the Israelite fold, but the 'Spirit of God rested on them too' and they performed miracles. So, we are puzzled. Jesus answers this question in today's Mk 9:38-48 saying that 'even those who are not registered Catholics/Christian/believer in Christ' - when they perform a good deed for an 'insignificant person' (those without hope or earthly reward), such deeds are done to Christ himself. Therefore, Jesus teaches that we should be able to appreciate them and should not hurt or harm them. Such people are for us and not against us.

Let us consider the following examples: 1. An atheist working in the soup kitchen 2. High School children Building Houses in Mexico 3. Veterans Building Homes for the Homeless people. 4.Knitting Groups supplying dress materials to the Global south. 5.Doctors without Borders helping the wounded or displaced people. 6. Supporting the Education of the Orphans and destitute and SSVP & etc., The Church teaches that Christian people should be abe to embrace anyone who walks and works alongside with us in love regardless of our Theology or Ideology. God is Love and Love is what counts. In the end Love never fails. Therefore, we should not and need not foster disagreements for doing a good action. The Scripture today encourages us with the phrase "Whoever is not against us, is for us" MK 9.40

Collection for the Needs of the Church in Canada: Support for the Bishops of Canada to pursue the Church's pastoral mission.






STATEMENT OF APOLOGY

Statement of Apology by the Catholic Bishop of Canada to the Indigenous Peoples of this Land:

The Catholic Bishops of Canada, gathered in Plenary this week, took the opportunity to affirm and acknowledge to the Indigenous Peoples the suffering experienced in Canada's Indian Residential Schools. Many Catholic religious communities and dioceses participated in this system, which led to the suppression of Indigenous languages, culture and spirituality, failing to respect the rich history, traditions and wisdom of Indigenous Peoples. They acknowledged the grave abuses that were committed by some members of our Catholic community; physical, psychological, emotional, spiritual, cultural, and sexual. They also sorrowfully acknowledged the historical and ongoing trauma and the legacy of suffering and challenges faced by Indigenous Peoples that continue to this day. Along with those Catholic entities which were directly involved in the operation of the schools and which have already offered their own heartfelt apologies, the Catholic Bishops of Canada expressed their profound remorse and apologized unequivocally. Together with the many pastoral initiatives already underway in dioceses across the country, the Bishops pledged to undertake fundraising in each region of the country to support initiatives discerned locally with Indigenous partners. Furthermore, they invited the Indigenous Peoples to journey with us into a new era of reconciliation, helping us to prioritize initiatives of healing, to listen to the experience of Indigenous Peoples, especially to the survivors of Indian Residential Schools, and to educate our clergy, consecrated men and women, and lay faithful, on Indigenous cultures and spirituality. They further committed to continue the work of providing documentation or records that will assist in the memorialization of those buried in unmarked graves. A delegation of Indigenous survivors, Elders/knowledge keepers, and youth will meet with the Holy Father in December 2021. Pope Francis will encounter and listen to the Indigenous Peoples, so as to discern how he can support our common desire to renew relationships and walk together along the path of hope in the coming years. The Bishops of Canada have pledged to work with the Holy See and our Indigenous partners on the possibility of a pastoral visit by the Pope to Canada as part of this healing journey. We are committed to continue the journey with the First Nations, Métis and Inuit Peoples of this land. For more information, please contact the diocese or visit www.cccb.ca.
