Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord...

"Day of the Lord! Who could endure it!". Day of the Lord is the Theophany/Visitation of the Lord or Judgement of the Lord!". Day of the Lord would also mean "Victory/Deliverance of God (Ex 14:1-14) or Doom & Sentence by Yahweh on Nations". (Is 1:10-17) The Day of the Lord is not only universal but also the Cosmic catastrophe. The Prophet Amos, an 8th century Prophet spoke about the 'Downfall of Israel' and his contemporary Hosea alluded to the 'events that threatened the people and nations'. Generally, 'Day of the Lord' was understood in the context of those in power especially when they failed their people, disaster was expected The Prophets predicted doom & gloom to the rulers of the nation's announcing good tides for those who suffered. According to them 'the day of the lord' is irresistible or inevitable. Prophet Micah predicted that the Day of the Lord was imminent due to the historical forces. Jeremiah and Ezekiel foretold the 'fall of Jerusalem' a punishment attributed to Yahweh himself.

Repentance and Reparation was the remedy to the 'Day of the Lord'. People were made aware of their personal and collective sins, failures and weaknesses especially wickedness of the nations. People were admonished to call on the name of God, that is to 'seek the mercy of God'. When their requests were sincere, the 'Lord Relented', because 'He is Kind & Merciful. Slow to anger and abounding in Steadfastness'. (Ps 103:8) He forgives. He loves us. He embraces everyone despite their sinfulness. Such a message gave the people hope and they always cherished the mercies of the Lord. As a fulfillment of His promises, God announces the 'Birth of the Messiah, Jesus.

Son of Justice and Prince of peace!' Christ's coming announces a New historical reality to the humans inviting them for a joyful life-style leading to their justification/uprightness. Paul in Romans 1:17 Wrote: "The Just Live by Faith. Faith in the Son of God, who loved us and gave Himself up for us".

But how can we endure the "Day of the Lord?" For the past two and a half years we have been enduring the untimely pandemic, Corona Virus. 'Endurance' is the ability to sustain a specific activity like swimming, cycling, running for an hour etc. Endurance gives the ability to withstand hardship or resist a hostile thought or action. Endurance is the 'ability, stamina or power' that helps us make things come through. Therefore, endurance is the 'capacity /state of mind' that motivates us for perseverance, developing strength and character in the individual. Character strengthens our hope and hope leads to salvation. Jesus endured his suffering. Paul in Romans 5:4 asks this beautiful question: "Can we boast about our sufferings?". When we endure them, they teach us patience as we know. Patience brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope, and this hope is not deceptive, because the Love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit".

'Day of the Lord' ultimately advises us to 'seek the face of God' for Reconciliation or Atonement. Reconciliation in the secular sense denotes a change in relationship between individuals, groups or nations both in social and Political environments. It means a change from anger, hostility or alienation to love, friendship or intimacy. people should be able to change or modify their feelings or attitudes as a sign of change. In the Religious sense, Reconciliation is a call to the humans to reconcile with God. Paul applied this image as God reconciling the humans in Christ. We are enemies of God by our sinfulness, but Christ had made us friends with God through his Birth, Life, Death & Resurrection. Reconciliation is God's initiative. It is God through Christ who makes this reconciliation possible from enmity to friendship (2 Cor 5:18-19) "While we were enemies, we were reconciled to go by the death of His Son and He saved us. Through reconciliation God gives us the Joy to rejoice with the heavenly cohort. "In Christ God was reconciling the world

to himself". (2 Cor 5:19 & Rm 11:15) All the best.




